
Allâhumma lâ sahla illâ mâ ja'altahu sahlâ wa anta taj'alu al-hazana idhâ shi'ta sahlâ.

2. Always be in a state of Shukr and Sabr

Hadith in Sahih Muslim

Suhayb reported: The Messenger of Allah, peace and blessings be upon him, said, "Wondrous is the affair of a believer, as there is good for him in every matter; this is not the case for anyone but a believer. If he experiences pleasure, he thanks Allah and it is good for him. If he experiences harm, he shows patience and it is good for him."



2. Renew Intentions

- Knowledge is beneficial for a believer, this includes Islamic knowledge and Secular Knowledge.
- If we utilize this knowledge for benefiting ourselves and Islam in the future than we will be rewarded.
- Making the right intention is crucial for securing the reward.

Having Tawakkul

- "Tie your camel first, and then put your trust in Allah"
- Means tawakkul is trusting that no matter what happens it is in Allah's hands.
- Having Tawakkul is Asking Allah for help and than putting effort in the means to achieve that goal.
